Qualification for World Cups

There is a maximum of four competitors per country per weight category including the organizing country.

USA Judo’s World Cup Selection Procedures are available at <http://judo.usoc.org/content/index/842>.

Qualification for Grand Slam and Grand Prix

There is a maximum of two competitors per country per weight category. For the organizing country there will be a maximum of four competitors per weight category. Only two competitors from the organizing country may receive points for the World Ranking List.

Qualification for Masters

The top 16 competitors per weight category from the World Ranking List will be invited to compete at the Masters. A minimum of one competitor from the organizing country will compete in each weight category. If the organizing country has no competitor among the top 16, then the top 15 from the World Ranking List and one competitor from the organizing country will compete. The IJF selection procedures for the Masters tournament will be followed. They will be posted on www.ijf.org.

Qualification for World Championships

There is a maximum of two competitors per country per weight category. USA Judo’s World Championship Selection Procedures are available at www.usjudo.org/seniors_compopportunities.asp.

Qualification for Pan American Championships

There is a maximum of one competitor per country per weight category. USA Judo's Pan American Championships Selection Procedures are available at

www.usjudo.org/seniors_comportunities.asp.

- C. Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process to become Team nominees (including maximum Team size).

The maximum team size is 14 athletes, one representing each weight category. The 14 weight categories are: Men (60kg, 66kg, 73kg, 81kg, 90kg, 100kg, and 100+kg); Women (48kg, 52kg, 57kg, 63kg, 70kg, 78kg, and 78+kg).

The qualification slot will go directly to an athlete, not a nation.

The World Ranking List as of April 30th, 2012 will determine the allocation of all the places to athletes for the 2012 Olympic Games. The World Ranking List will consist of points earned from World Cups, Grand Prix, Grand Slams, Masters, World Championships and Pan Am Championships and can be found at www.ijf.org.

Qualification to Olympic Games

The athletes are identified by following the ranking position in each weight category from top to bottom until 22 different countries are represented for men and 14 for women.

- If the USA has one athlete ranked in this block, this athlete is directly qualified.
- If the USA has two athletes ranked in this block a 2012 Olympic Trials (date and place, TBA) will be held. If the highest ranked athlete wins the first match he/she shall be the athlete selected in that weight category of competition. If the highest ranked athlete loses then the ranked athletes shall engage in a best of three fight-off. The winner of that fight-off shall be the athlete selected for that weight category of competition.
- If more than two athletes are ranked in this block a tournament will be held at the 2012 Olympic Trials. If the highest ranked athlete wins the 2012 Olympic Trials he/she shall be the athlete selected in that weight category of competition. If the highest ranked athlete loses the 2012 Olympic Trials will continue with the highest ranked

athlete and the winner of the tournament shall then engage in a best of three fight-off that same day. The winner of that fight-off shall be the athlete selected for that weight category.

Continental Qualification to Olympic Games

In addition to the qualified athletes the next best athletes will qualify on a continental quota based on the World Ranking List. The Continental Union will allocate the remaining slots across all weight divisions. If the Continental Union fails to use it full allocation, any remaining slot or slots will be returned to the IJF who will distribute it according to the World Ranking List.

III. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- A. Prior to acceptance of nominations by the USOC, the USA Judo has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is to be nominated to the Team by the USA Judo may be removed as a nominee for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Judo:

- Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the USA Judo CEO/Executive Director.
- Injury or illness as certified by an approved USA Judo physician (or

medical staff). If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by an approved USA Judo physician (or medical staff), his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.

- Violation of the USA Judo's Code of Conduct. (Attachment "A")

An athlete who may be removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the USA Judo Constitution and Bylaws Article 14 or by USOC Bylaws, Section 9.

- B. After acceptance of nominations by the USOC, the USOC has jurisdiction over the Team under the USOC Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures. This occurs no earlier than 45 days and no later than 30 days prior to the Opening Ceremonies of the Games (unless expressly waived by the USOC).

A Team member who is accepted by the USOC is subject to the USOC Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures.

- C. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team at any time for violation of IOC, PASO, IPC, WADA, IJF, USADA and/or USOC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as applicable. In such instances, the adjudication process will be managed through the United States Anti-Doping Agency.

- If the USA has only one athlete ranked in the Top 22 for men or Top 14 for women the IJF will replace the athlete with the highest ranked athlete from the World Ranking List in that weight category.
 - If the USA has two athletes ranked in the Top 22 for men or Top 14 for women the replacement athlete will be the 2nd place finisher at the 2012 Olympic Trials in that weight

category.

- If the USA has three or more athletes ranked in the Top 22 for men or Top 14 for women the replacement athlete will be the 2nd place finisher at the 2012 Olympic Trials in that weight category. If both athletes withdraw from nomination then highest ranked athlete on the World Ranking List will be the replacement in that weight category.



ATHLETE PLEDGE

I pledge to uphold the spirit of the USA Judo Code of Conduct (the “Code”), which offers a guide to my conduct as a member of the 2012 Olympic Team (the “Team”). I acknowledge that I have a right to a hearing if my opportunity to compete is denied or if I am charged with a violation of this Code.

I have familiarized myself with the Code and understand that acceptance of its provisions is a condition of my selection to the 2012 Olympic Team.

As a Member of the Team, I hereby promise and agree that I:

- will abide by all rules related to the Team selection procedures as approved by USA Judo;
- have acted and will act in a sportsmanlike manner consistent with the spirit of fair play and responsible conduct;
- will maintain a level of fitness and competitive readiness that will permit my performance to be at the maximum of my abilities;
- will not commit a doping violation as defined by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) or the International Judo Federation (IJF) rules;
- am not currently serving a doping violation and/or do not have a pending or unresolved doping charge;
- will not engage in any conduct that is criminal under any laws applicable to me, including, but not limited to laws governing the possession and use of drugs and alcohol and providing of drugs to any person and of alcohol to minors;
- am eligible to compete under the rules of IJF;
- will refrain from conduct detracting from my ability or that of my teammates to attain peak

performance;

- will respect the property of others whether personal or public;
- will respect members of my Team, other teams, spectators and officials, and engage in no form of discriminatory behavior or verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;
- will follow my Team's rules, including by way of example, rules regarding curfew and required attendance at team meetings;
- am aware that USA Judo sponsors, suppliers and licensees provide critical support for the Team and, in recognition of this fact, I will wear designated USA Judo apparel at all official Team functions and events;
- will not conceal or cover-up any USA Judo sponsor, supplier or licensee brand or other identification appearing on my USA Judo apparel;
- agree to be filmed and photographed by the official photographer(s) and network(s) of USA Judo under conditions authorized by USA Judo and give event organizers and USA Judo the right to use my name, picture, likeness, and biographical information before, during and after the period of my participation in these activities to promote the activity in which I participate or to promote the success of the team on which I compete; in no event may USA Judo or the event organizers use or authorize the use of my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information for the purpose of trade, including any use in a manner that would imply an endorsement of any company, product, or service, without my written permission;
- will not use or authorize the use of photographs, films or videos of myself in my USA Judo apparel or equipment or the use of the USA Judo logo for the purpose of trade, without the prior written consent of the USA Judo (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld);
- will act in a way that will bring respect and honor to myself, my teammates, USA Judo and the United States; and
- will remember that at all times I am an ambassador for my sport, my country and the Olympic Movement.
